#### WEBSITE UPDATES

Perhaps you've noticed a few changes on the website. The sermon format is just one example. The sermons can now be found on the second menu button on the website. This exciting new format will provide Westminster members with the capability to listen to their favorite sermon via an iPod or MP3 player. The written sermons can be found to the immediate right of the audio sermon icon. Below are the instructions for downloading your favorite sermons.

#### What is podcasting?

Podcasting is a way of getting your favorite audio content (such as sermons, radio shows, or music) automatically. Once you've subscribed to a site's podcast, your computer will automatically check for updates and download them when your computer is idle. You can also choose to pre-load these programs onto your iPod or music player. This means that if you subscribe to several podcasts that you like, then leave your computer and Ipod connected overnight, you can pick the ipod up on the way out of the door in the

#### How do I subscribe?

Our browser includes built in feed readers. You'll simply need to find the option within that program to subscribe to a feed, and enter, http://www.nashvillewpc.org/podcast.csm, as the address. In Itunes, select "subscribe to podcast" under the "Advanced" menu. What sermons come in the podcast? You'll receive one new sermon each week from our Sunday morning worship service.

#### Do I need an iPod?

No. Although podcasting gets its name from the iPod, you do not need one to enjoy podcasts. The sermons will download to your computer, and you can listen to them at your leisure from your computer.

### Where do I get this podcast?

If you have itunes installed, you can click on this podcast link to subscribe directly using Itunes. If you do not have Itunes, or prefer to use an alternate feed reader, the podcast address is http://www.nashvillewpc.org/podcast.csm. It's best to highlight the address, copy it, and paste it into Itunes or your RSS feed reader.

LENT: The word "Lent" is derived from the Old English word "lecten," meaning "Spring," which in turn derives from the Old High German lenzin, referring to "the lengthening of days." The season we know as Spring was originally called Lent. Lent gradually adhered strictly to church practice, and Spring came to designate the season following Winter. Lent lasts for forty weekdays plus Sundays, a number richly grounded in Biblical tradition. In the Bible there are one hundred-twenty references to the number forty. Among them: the days of Noah's deluge; the days that Moses spent on the mountain; the years Israel wandered in the wilderness; the days of Elijah's journey to the cave of the "still, small voice;" and Jesus' forty-day wilderness sojourn in which he was tempted by Satan. Lent has traditionally been a time in which Christians have engaged in self-reflection, fasting, prayer, confession and repentance in anticipation of the celebration of the Resurrection of Christ. At Westminster, in order to emphasize the meaning of Lent, we adopt a more penitential posture in worship. There are no flowers; no festive


COLORS AND SYMBOLS OF LENT: The color used in the sanctuary for most of Lent is purple. This color symbolizes both the pain and suffering leading up to the crucifixion of Jesus as well as the suffering of humanity and the world under sin. But purple is also the color of royalty, and so anticipates through the suffering and death of Jesus, the coming resurrection and hope of newness that will be celebrated in the Resurrection on Easter Sunday.

Imagine being a part of helping someone to achieve that for themselves. Once again we need your time, your talents and your tithes to make this mission possible.
