Alternative Spring Break Mission to Help Katrina Victims

Next week a courageous, compassionate group of Westminster members will set out on an Alternative Spring Break to the Mississippi Gulf Coast. Their goal is to try to make life a little better for residents of the area whose homes and lives were devastated by Hurricane Katrina. The group is a true intergenerational group with over 35 people, ranging in age from 6 to 60, will know what it means to give their time and talents when they return on March 24.

Much of the work to be done is hard, grimy work – not a typical spring break. Homes still need to be cleaned and, in many cases, gutted from the inside. We have an experience crew of roofers that will be patching and roofing homes. Hopefully, some homes may be ready for new drywall and paint to get ready for families to move in and get their lives back in order.

The Mennonite Camp will be hosting the group while they are working. Next door to the camp is God's Katrina Kitchen, which provides three meals a day to workers and residents of Pass Christian, MS. The Westminster volunteers will eat some of their meals there, and may spend some time working to feed others.

Your prayers for the volunteers and the victims of Katrina are appreciated.


